

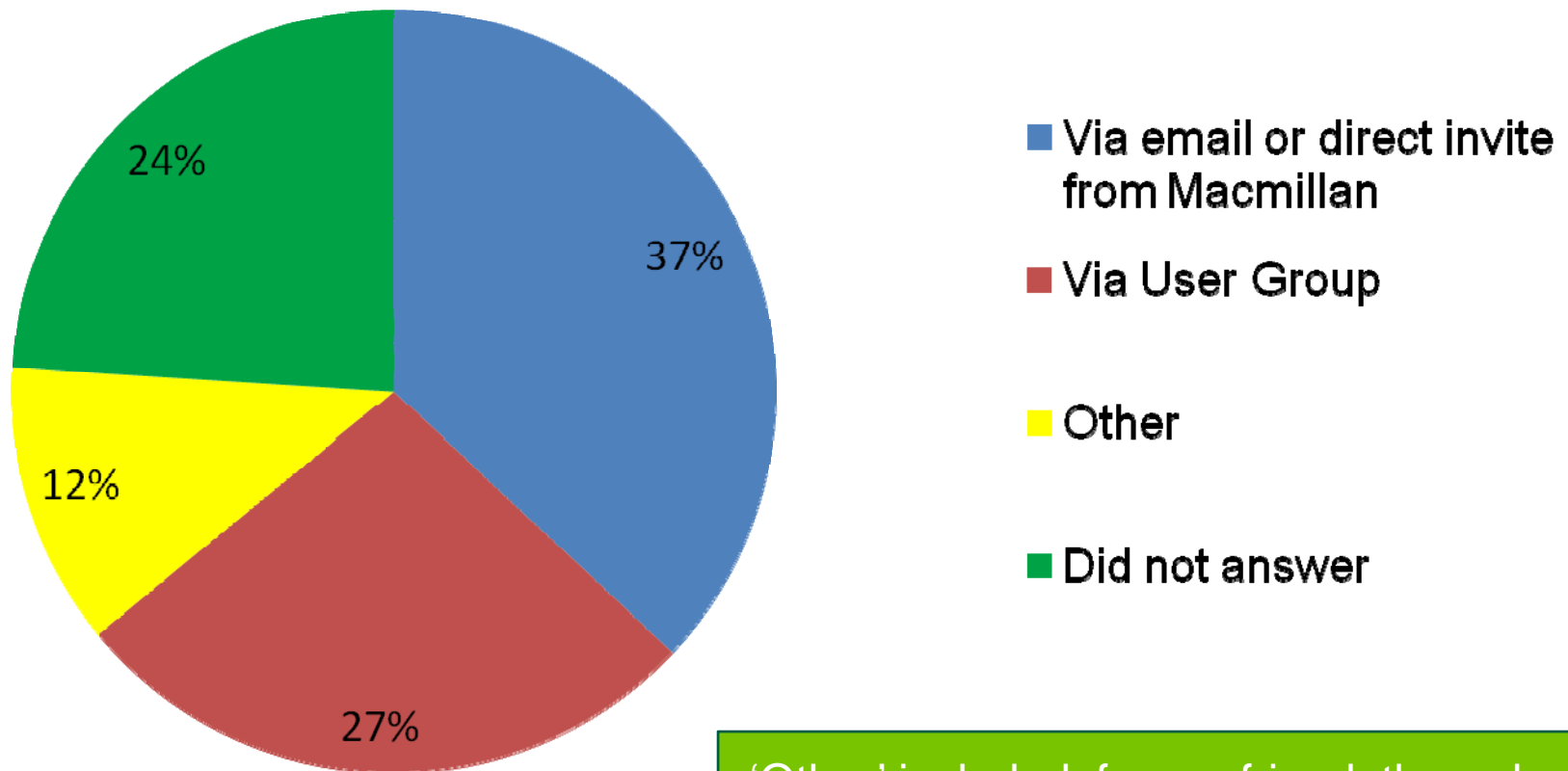

A presentation of the data taken from the feedback forms

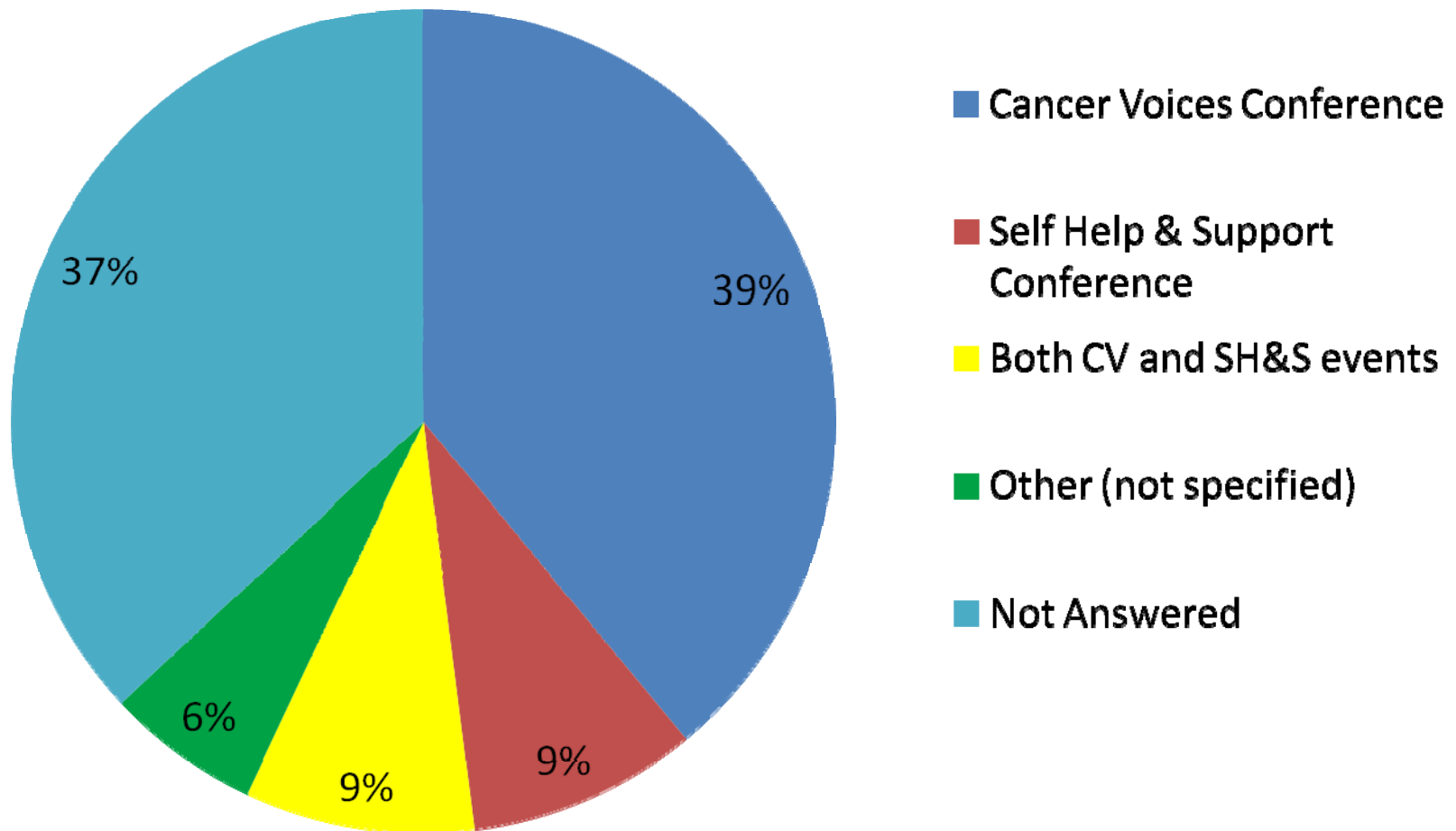
- The East Midlands and Northern England Region Cancer Voices event took place on November 24 2008 at the Sheffield United football ground.

# How did you hear about the conference?

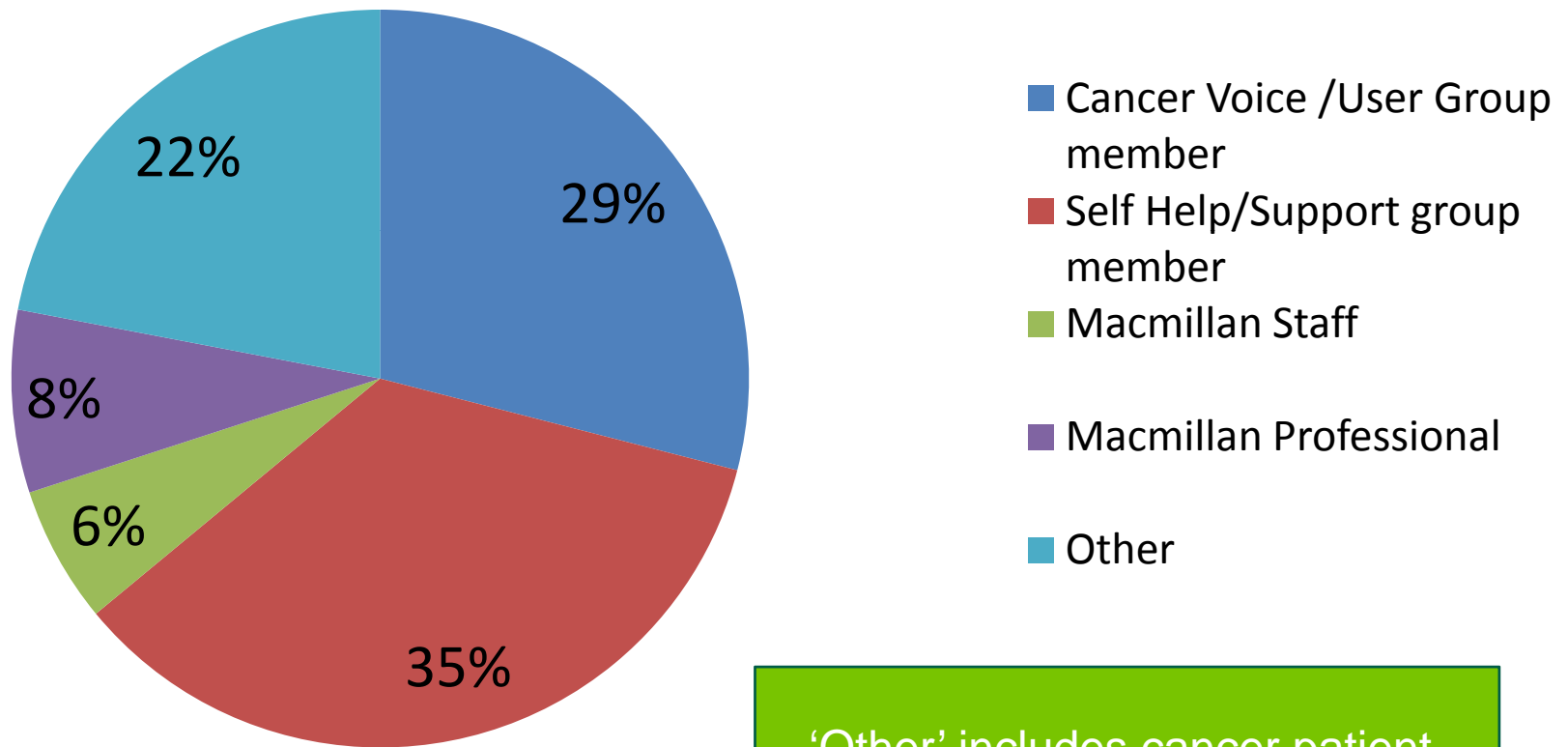

# Have you attended a Macmillan event before?

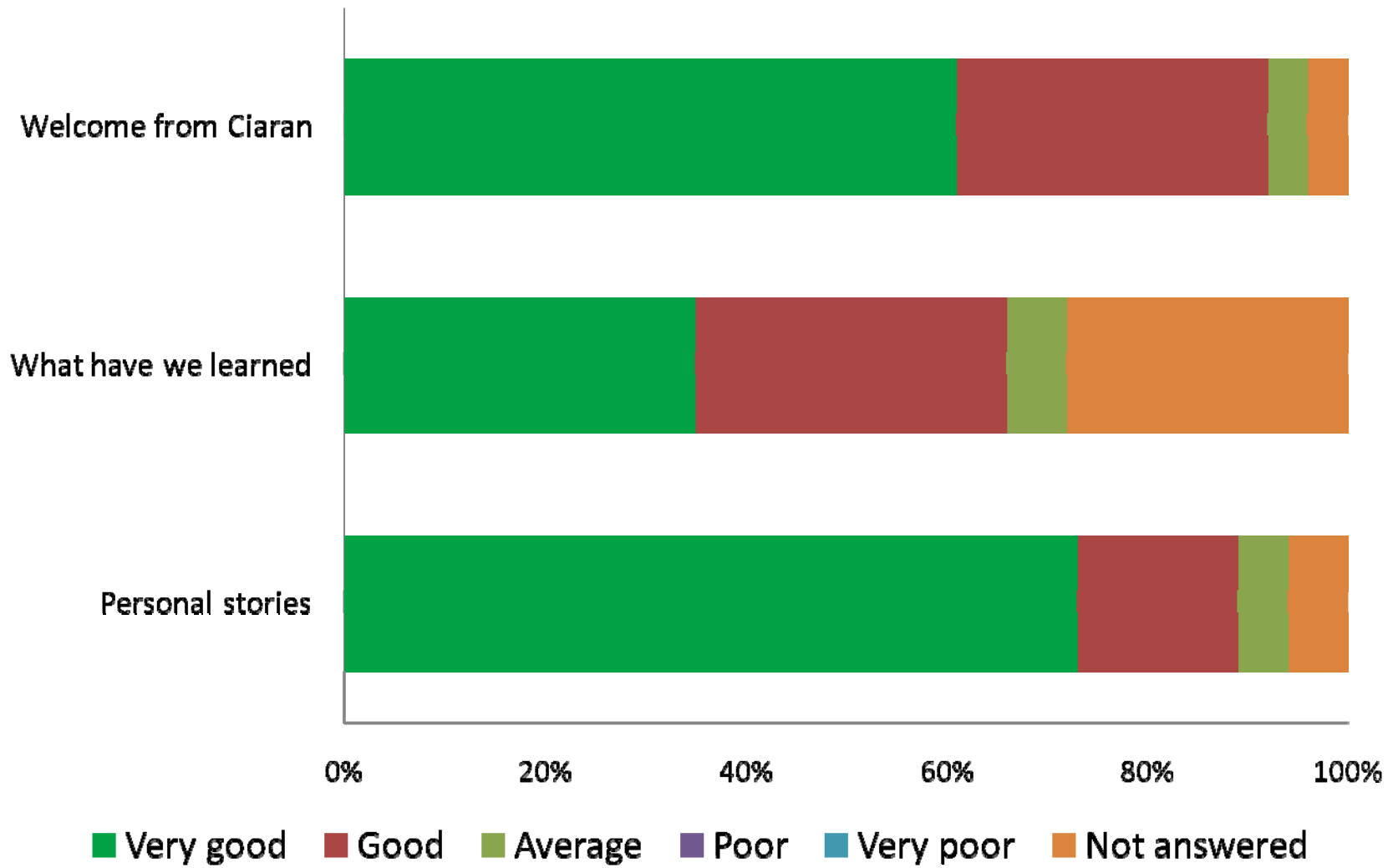


# Which of the following describes you?



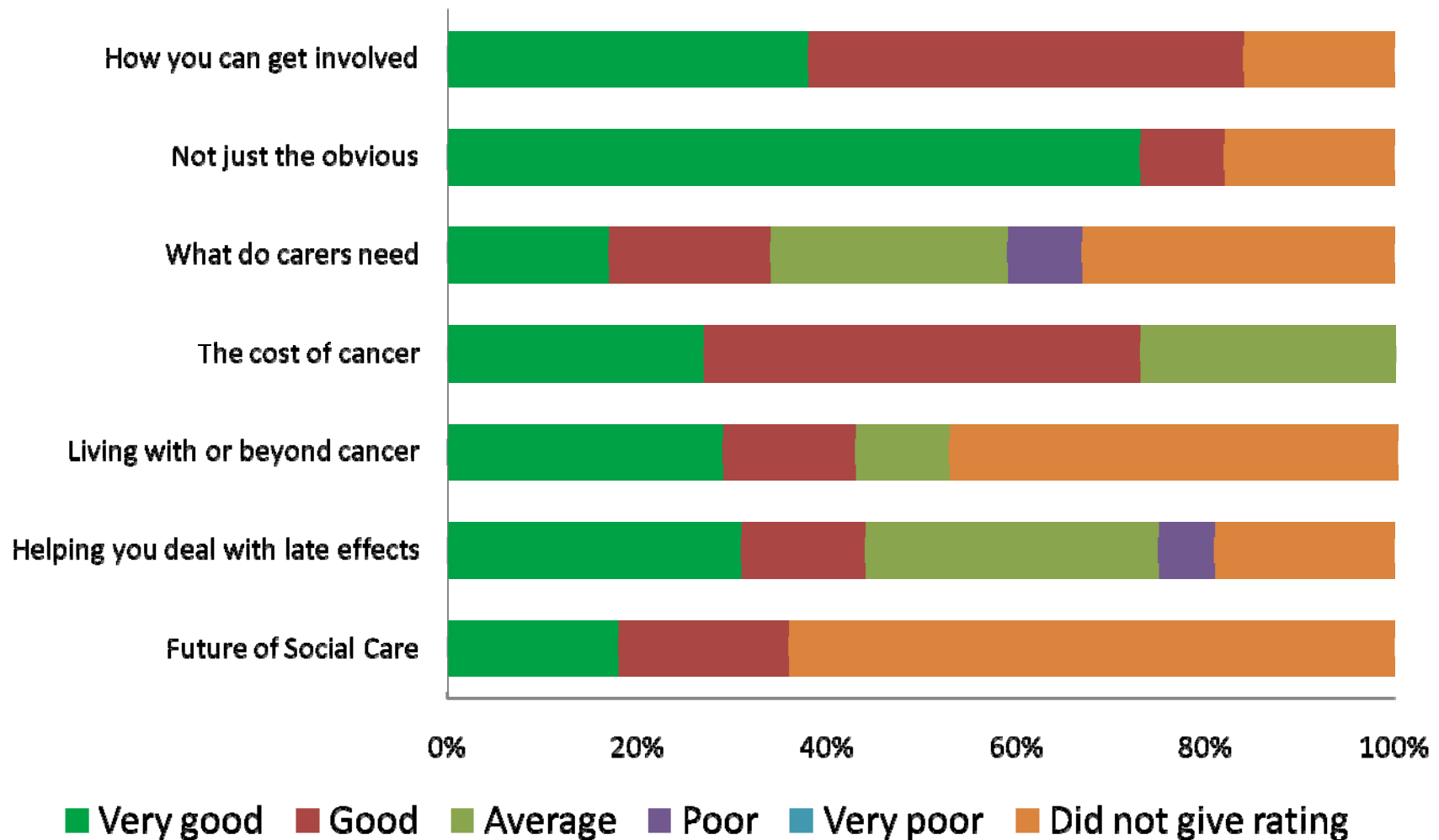

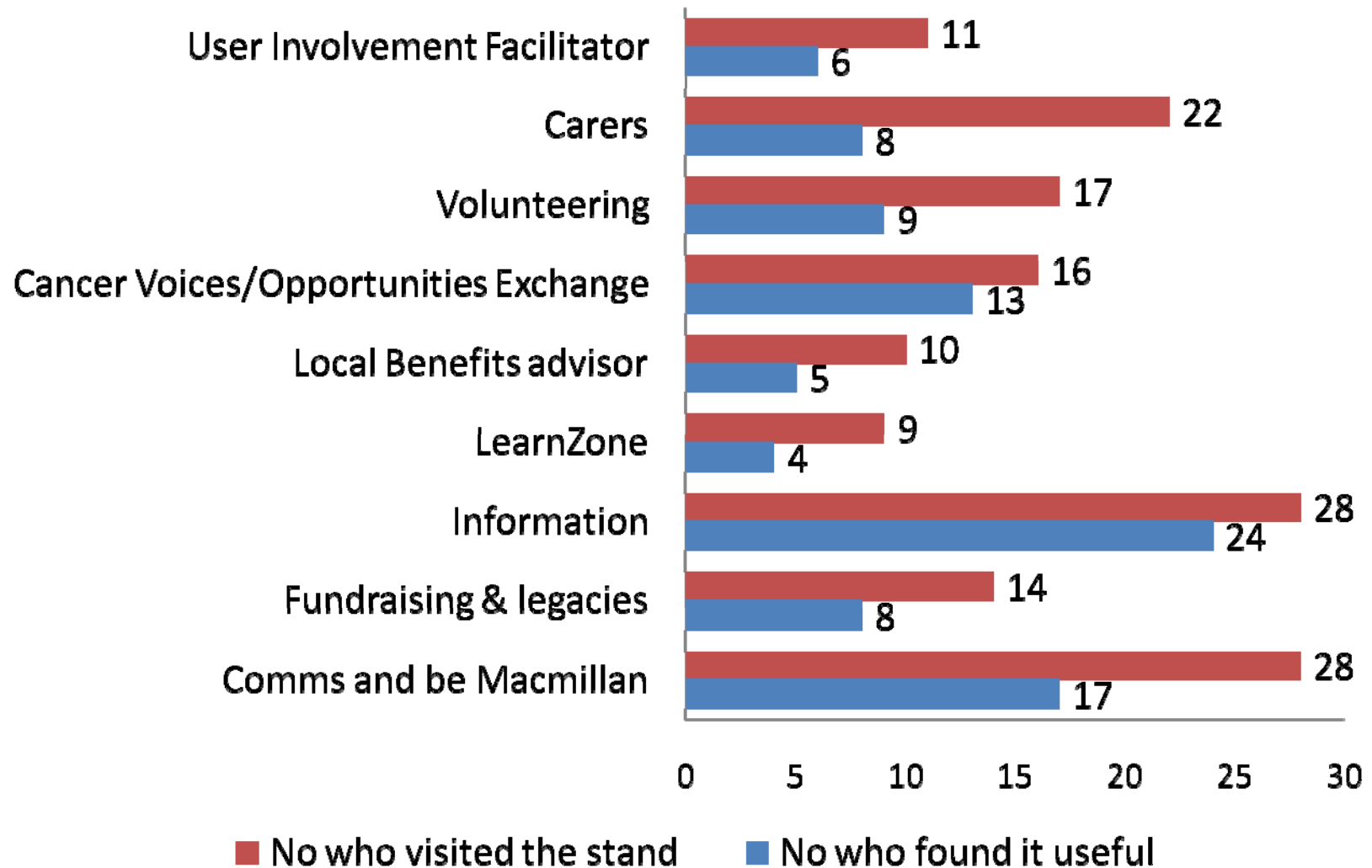

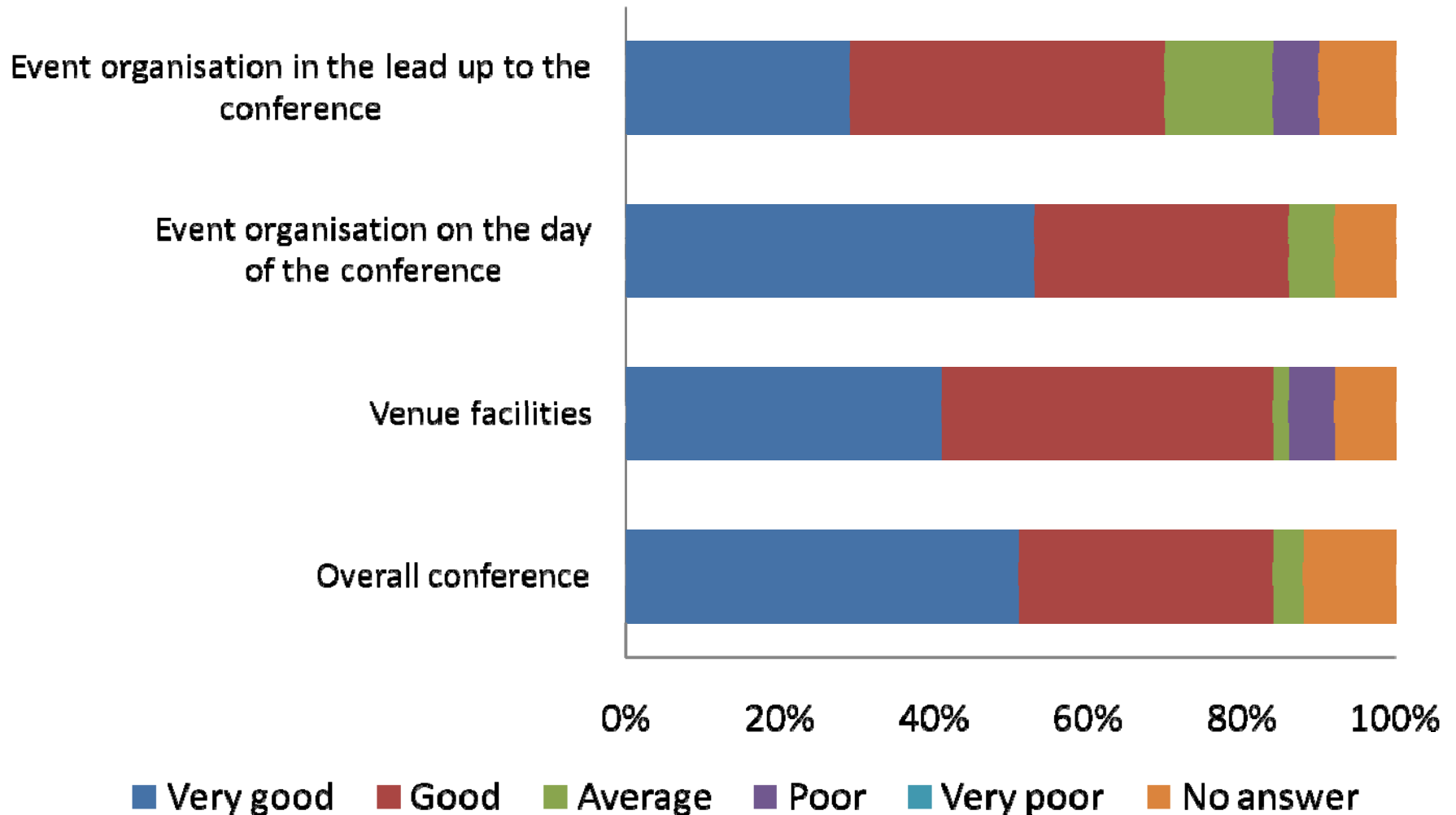
Respondents were asked to state which workshop they attended and rate it on a scale of very good-very poor.



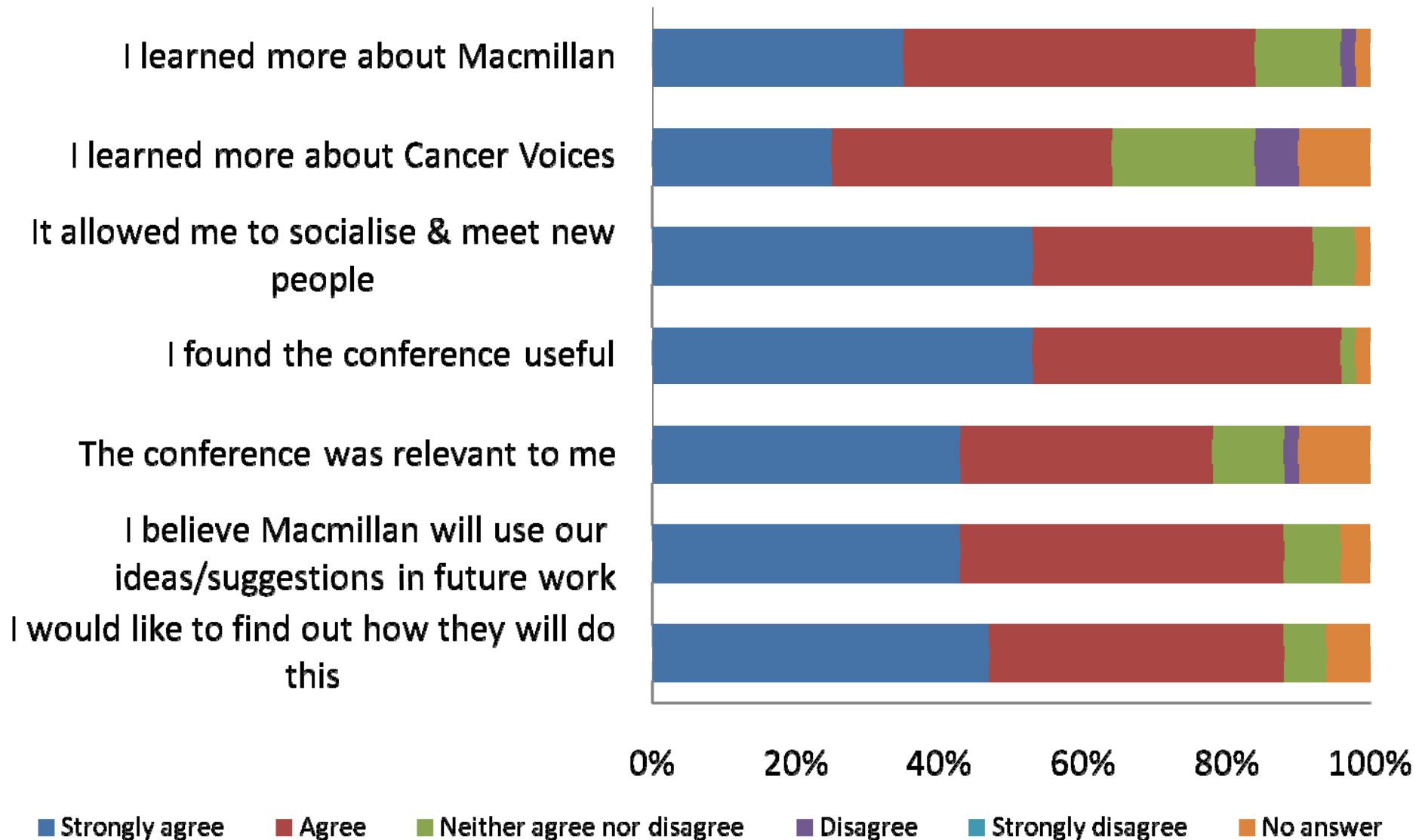

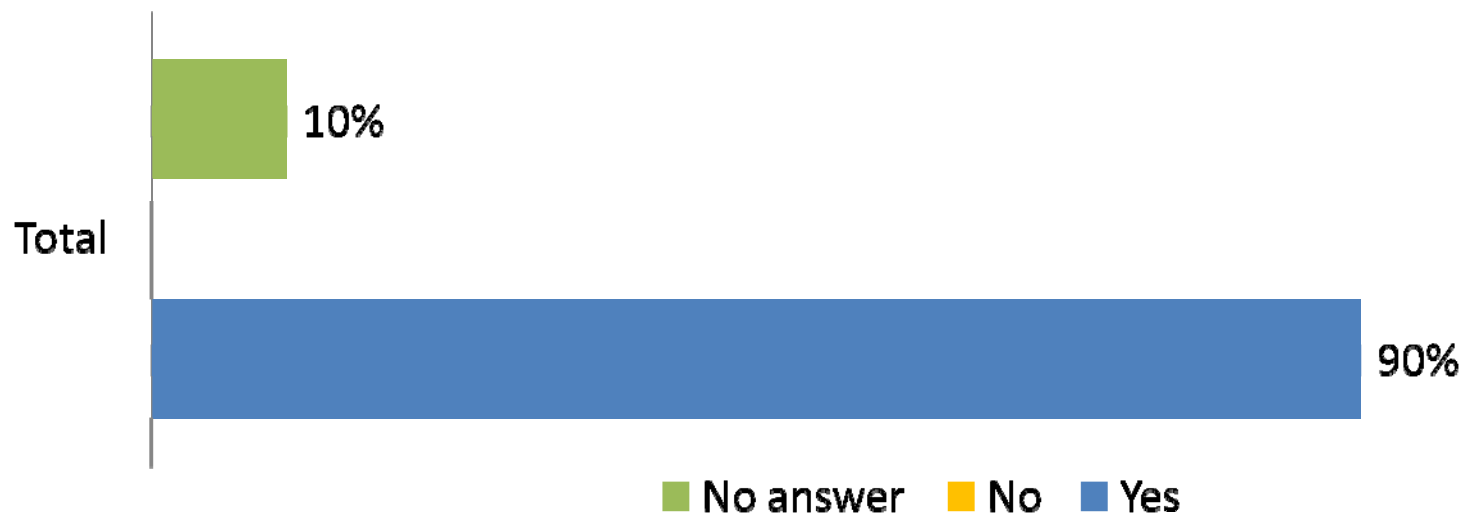
