

Macmillan Fellowship Description

Fellowships can be awarded to Macmillan professionals who have won a Service Improvement, Innovation or Integration Excellence award. Fellowships are awarded to individual professionals, and therefore winners of a Team Excellence award are not eligible. Up to three fellowships may be awarded each year. A Macmillan professional can only be nominated for a fellowship in the same year they won an award.

A Macmillan Fellow:

- is a Macmillan Excellence Award winner
- has been a Macmillan professional for more than five years
- has a history of being engaged with Macmillan
- is an exemplar of Macmillan's values
- demonstrates leadership in their field
- is active in networks and has wider impact beyond their day to day role
- has credibility in their chosen field and sets the highest standards
- is inspirational in their chosen field

Fellowships signify a long term relationship with Macmillan, irrespective of whether a fellow remains a Macmillan professional or moves into other roles. As we appoint more fellows, Macmillan's provision for fellows and how they contribute to the organisation will evolve. Initially the fellowship is envisaged as follows:

<p>A Fellowship grant:</p> <p>Up to a maximum of £10,000 per fellow that can be drawn on for up to three years from the date of the award. This would be for significant CPD that develops their: leadership; expertise; research in a field of interest <i>and</i> benefits their organisation and people affected by cancer.</p> <p>Examples of how the grant can be used include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - covering the costs of a research project, Masters or PhD - provision of expert facilitation / mentoring / coaching to support CPD and / or career development - cover for the cost of travel overseas to explore and understand alternative service delivery models and use this intelligence to influence how these could be deployed in the UK. <p>Ongoing guidance and support with the fellowship would be provided to the fellow once they have been appointed.</p>	<p>Engagement with Macmillan:</p> <p>Provide continued expertise and leadership in wider Macmillan work related to their relevant area for up to the equivalent of three days per year e.g. influencing policy, steering group membership, contributing to Macmillan research programme, becoming an awards panel member.</p> <p>Publication</p> <p>Write articles for publication in e.g. Mac Voice, professional journals</p> <p>Sharing Expertise</p> <p>Present at the annual Macmillan Professionals National Event and wider learning and development forums.</p> <p>Promotion</p> <p>All activities that are funded by the grant should acknowledge Macmillan and the use of the fellowship.</p> <p>Fellows to wear a Macmillan fellow badge when in work.</p>
