We set up Tom's Gift because we know first hand what your family is going through. And we know that even the smallest things can make a massive difference at times like this.

Our son, Tom Grahame, was diagnosed with a malignant brain tumour a few weeks before his fifth birthday. He went through months of treatment, including surgery, radiotherapy and chemotherapy, and spent many long hours in hospital waiting rooms and children's wards.

One of the few things that made Tom smile back then was a present – his favourite was always Lego or Playmobil. Tom's face used to light up. And for the next few hours, he could forget about everything else and just enjoy his gift.

We'd like your child to have something to enjoy too, just like Tom. That's why we've set up Tom's Gift.

It's very easy to apply for Tom's Gift. If your child has been diagnosed with a malignant brain tumour requiring treatment complete this form together with their nurse, doctor, health or social care professional and send it to the address on the right-hand side. We'll then send your child a £30 gift voucher, which can be used to shop in store or online, to spend on a present of their choice at Debenhams.

We hope this puts a smile on your child's face, just like it did for our Tom.

Application guidance for professionals and families

Who is Tom's gift for?

Tom's Gift is a one-off gift for all children aged 0–16 who have been diagnosed with a malignant brain tumour requiring treatment and who are UK residents. However, we understand that the distinction between malignant and benign tumours is often very fine. We are keen to provide Tom's Gift to as many children requiring treatment (surgery, chemotherapy, radiotherapy or any combination thereof) as possible. If you are in any doubt and require guidance on the qualifying criteria for Tom's Gift, please contact the Macmillan Grants team who will be happy to help.

Who can complete the form?

- Part 1 should be completed and signed by someone with parental responsibility or legal guardianship.
- Parts 2 and 3 need to be completed and signed by a health or social care professional.

How is Tom's Gift sent out?

Once an application has been processed, Macmillan will post Tom's Gift to the child at the address provided on the application form. Details of how to redeem the voucher and further information will be provided together with the Debenhams voucher.
