You can learn about how your social life may change when you have cancer.




If you are worried about your health, you should talk to a doctor or nurse.

It is important that you do not stop doing things you enjoy.




You can make it easier for yourself by:

 not trying to do too much, and doing things for a shorter time



 making sure you have a rest before you do something



 telling your friends that you would like to spend some time with them doing quieter things.



if you want to go to the pub, you can have soft drinks instead of having alcohol. This means it will not affect your treatment.



Your friends may not ask about how you feel. They may be worried about upsetting you.



But it is good to talk to your friends about how you are feeling. They will want to listen and help.
