Council Tax Reduction

Reduced council tax in England, Scotland and Wales for people on a low income or claiming benefits.

I need help with health or care costs

Dental care

Help with the cost of dental care depends on where you live in the UK, vour age and sometimes other criteria.

I need help with travel costs

Blue Badge Scheme

Access to closer parking and some free parking for people with certain medical conditions, or who get certain benefits. Pages 193 to 196 of Help with the cost of cancer.

Healthcare Travel Costs Scheme

Refunds on travel costs for people who have to go to hospital for planned tests or treatments. For people on a low income or people who get, or have a partner who gets, certain benefits. Pages 182 to 183 of Help with the cost of cancer.

Highlands and Islands Travel Scheme

For people in the former Highlands and Islands Development Board area that have to travel certain distances to hospital for planned tests or treatments.

Hospital parking

Free parking at hospitals in Scotland and Wales. Some free parking in England. Free parking in Northern Ireland for some people. Page 184 of Help with the cost of cancer.

Isles of Scilly Travel Cost Scheme

For Isles of Scilly residents to get to and from the mainland to hospital for planned tests or treatment.

Motability Scheme

Help to hire a car, scooter or powered wheelchair using part of your payment from certain benefits.
