





Have safer sex




Having safer sex can help to keep you healthy.



If you have sex without a condom or dental dam, you may get an **infection**. Some infections may lead to cancer.



An **infection** is when germs attack your body. Infections might make you feel unwell.



One of these infections is called **HPV**.


HPV is an infection that can be passed between people. Most of the time it is harmless. But sometimes it can lead to cancer. This may take years.



All children aged 12 or 13 are offered a jab to protect them against 2 types of HPV.



Sometimes other people can have the jab too. To find out if you can have the jab talk to your doctor or nurse.




Another infection is called **Hepatitis B**.


This is a virus that infects your blood. It can damage your liver, and may cause liver cancer.




There is a jab to help protect against Hepatitis B. Talk to your doctor or nurse to find out more.



Hepatitis C is an infection that can rarely be spread by unsafe sex. It can affect the liver and may cause liver cancer.



You might not know if the person you are having sex with has an infection.



It is best to always use a condom, whoever you are having sex with.



Talk to your doctor, nurse or healthcare worker if you need any more information about safer sex.
