We're pleased to announce that in version 5.5 of Emis Web the QCancer® risk score prompts are now available. These prompts alert a GP to a patient with a risk of cancer equal to or greater than 5%. The alert prompt has been released in an inactive form to all Emis users, and to receive these prompts you will need to [activate the protocol](#) which Emis have added to their [library](#).

We have been working with Vision INPS to build an integrated version of the tool within their system; it is similar to the original tool developed with BMJ Informatica and uses the Risk Assessment Tool (RAT), produced by Willie Hamilton.
