Clare Hollingsworth

Clare joined the board in April 2011. Jenny Ritchie-Campbell

Jenny is Macmillan's director of cancer services innovation. Jenny's team develops Macmillan's services strategies in the areas of health & social care; information & financial support; and learning & development. Her team also looks after Macmillan's involvement in the NCSI survivorship programme, volunteering, inclusion and Macmillan environments. Jenny joined Macmillan in early 2010 and was joint head of the intelligence & research department prior to being appointed a director in June 2011. Jenny's background is in the services sector: Firstly as a banker and then as a management consultant. Jenny spent over 15 years as a strategy consultant, specialising in large scale transformational change programmes across both the public and private sector and working in many different countries and cultures. Jenny holds an MA from the University of Edinburgh, an MBA from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania and is also a qualified banker.

Andrew Donald

In 2001 Andrew worked with the department of health with Professor Sir Mike Richards, on the cancer network development programme. Since then he spent six years in commissioning with Birmingham East and North PCT, and was chair of the palliative care network. He is now director of commissioning development for the Staffordshire cluster. He has worked with Macmillan Cancer Support on their engagement with commissioners on pilot prevention projects and on managed care pathways. He says "I am particularly interested in Macmillan because of its wide ranging approach to partnerships and innovation."

Peggotty Moore

Peggotty qualified as a therapy radiographer in 1996, and in 2003 was appointed a Macmillan specialist radiographer. Initially her role was both supportive to patients and to review, update and produce good quality information and consent forms for radiotherapy. Her role has evolved with the needs of patients and she now manages a team of radiographers who review and support patients undergoing radiotherapy. The team work alongside doctors to provide a service for patients that is accessible both during and after treatment. She is also involved with cancer network groups looking at improving local services and access to them, patient projects in the hospital such as the dignity and respect campaign, patient survey and design of patient related features of a new cancer treatment centre. She has also taken part in several fundraising events and treks for Macmillan Cancer Support, most recently in Jordan.

Heather Monteverde

Heather trained as a registered general nurse and a registered sick children's nurse in the Ulster Hospital. After working as a staff nurse, Heather undertook further specialist training in oncological nursing at Belvoir Park Hospital. In 1986 she was appointed as the first breast care nurse in Northern Ireland based in the Ulster Hospital. She remained in this post until 1995 when she took up post as an oncology nurse advisor for northern Ireland with Zeneca Pharmaceuticals. In 1999 she joined Macmillan Cancer Support. Over the past twelve years she has had a variety of roles within Macmillan and has been general manager for Northern Ireland since 2003. Heather was elected as chair of Long Term Conditions Alliance for NI in September 2010. She is a lay / community member of the South Eastern Local Commissioning Group.

Helen Hume

Helen cared for her husband and daughter, both of whom had cancer. Her first husband died 13 years ago of a brain tumour aged 44 and nearly 5 years ago her youngest daughter died of the same condition aged just 22. Helen is very well aware of the significant challenges of caring for loved ones during disability, treatment and end of life and the invaluable contribution made by Macmillan to support this. Helen regularly raises funds for Macmillan and in 2009 ran the London marathon as part of the Macmillan team. Helen would like to use her personal experience and professional skills to make a contribution to Macmillan.
